886-3118 cheats that I didn't previously know about and something called custom content/mods. So here I am downloading tons of custom content and mods (which is fan-generated game content made for players by players to tweak the gameplay to your liking).

New hairstyles, new clothes, beautiful pre set houses, the ability to have teen woohoo and teen pregnancy, master keys and that's just naming a few. Clicked on a link that said you could get all expansion packs and worlds (after The Sims 2 they made you pay for "special" pre set worlds like Dragon Valley, Sunlit Tides, and, Monte Vista) wait for it... FOR FREE.

I purchased The Sims 3, and The Sims 3 Expansion Packs Generations, Late Night, and World Adventures for like \$80.00 bucks on Origin. Now, by the way I make a comfortable amount of money working in research and  **Call Toll-Free: +1 (844)**

886-3118 development for a pharmaceutical company but anytime time I can save money I'm all ears! So...Imagine my surprise when I saw this link. I click the link, started downloading the game away and oh boy!

Window after window, after window, after window pops up and I couldn't stop it. FBI you are attempting to download illegal content. Wanting the FREE games and worlds to still download I never even considered turning the computer off. At last I get a notification pop up that says MICROSOFT.COM! YOU CAN NOT USE THE INTERNET ANY LONGER! YOU MUST CALL THIS NUMBER BECAUSE YOU HAVE ATTEMPTED TO DOWNLOAD ILLEGAL CONTENT. CALL 1-800-BLAH-BLAH-BLAH TO GET RID OF VIRUS WE HAVE DETECTED!

I FREAK OUT and try to close the windows which automatically keep popping up. I sigh long and hard, then start to get ready for the cops to show up, taking me and my computer in for downloading illegal content.
